LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- To increase knowledge of local identity, human dignity, the principles of unity and diversity, intercultural dialogue, and European social, cultural and historical heritage based on the history and identity of the Basque Country.
- Developing social and intercultural competences.
- To develop critical thinking and raise awareness about the negative effects of stereotypes, prejudices, with examples of innovative and participatory actions to reduce them and challenge negative narratives about diversity.
- Strengthening the key competences needed for personal development and self-fulfilment, for professional adaptation, active citizenship and social integration.
- Developing language competence.



METHODOLOGY

This course is based on **experiential learning and active participation.** Participants engage in the cultural and social realities of the Basque region, allowing them to better understand the relationship between **identity, heritage, and intercultural coexistence**.

Each day's session has been designed to promote skills such as critical thinking and communication. The activities and experiences are complemented by group debates and learning exercises where they collaborate, interact and listen to each other's ideas.

Emphasis is placed on **gamification and intercultural dialogue** as transformative tools in adult learning. Participants are not only external viewers but key actors who share their experiences actively. This participatory aspect ensures that learning is contextualised. Informal learning activities (such as shared meals or informal conversations) are also part of the training, which strengthens group cohesion and communication skills.

The programme concludes with a structured evaluation process, both individual and collective reflection, receiving feedback, and developing personal action plans for applying and disseminating the results in their local communities and professional environments once the programme is over.

DAY 1 - Identity and Urban Diversity

Introduction and presentation of the mobility programme and getting to know each other. Gathering of the group and presentation of the programme for the day, timetable presentation and practical arrangements, doubts and questions, and documentation.

Old Town Gymkhana Experience. Gamification as an example of an adult learning activity. Through multilingual and cultural games and guided exploration, participants developed intercultural awareness and local heritage appreciation using Bilbao's historic centre as an interactive classroom.

An educational guided tour through the neighbourhoods of San Francisco, Bilbao La Vieja and Zabala to show the cultural diversity of the city of Bilbao. The route is led by local neighbourhood residents who have previously been trained as intercultural guides. The project aims to promote new narratives and attitudes towards migration and cultural diversity.

Cultural visit to Bilborock. A cultural centre located in a former church that showcases the preservation of Bilbao's heritage while promoting the contemporary culture of Bilbao and the Basque Country.

^{*}Training sessions run approximately from 9:00 – 14:00, with optional cultural activities in the afternoons.

DAY 2 – Migration and Integration

Introduction and presentation of the mobility programme for Day 2. Providing participants with both theoretical and experiential learning opportunities that deepen their understanding of migration, integration, and cultural heritage.

Migratory Experiences. Darling Tuchany from the Kosmopolis Association will discuss the integration process of migrants into the local community, especially in Getxo. This talk will help participants understand the social and cultural challenges involved, fostering empathy and raising awareness about inclusive practices.

Heritage Site Visit. Cultural walk around the coast and historic fishing port of Algorta, Old Harbour and Paseo Zugazarte. Offering the opportunity to understand the historical significance of these locations and their role in shaping the cultural and economic development of the area.

DAY 3 – Al and Mental Health: Emotions, Empathy and Balance

Introduction and presentation of the mobility programme for Day 3. Focusing on the interplay between tradition and modernity in Bilbao.

Urban Transformation Walk. A guided cultural walk along the riverfront will highlight Bilbao's remarkable urban renewal. Participants will reflect on the city's transformation from an industrial hub to a model of sustainable development and cultural innovation.

Itsasmuseum. This visit offers a detailed look at Bilbao's maritime history and its importance to Basque identity. The museum serves as an image to explore how maritime heritage fosters unity in diversity and a sense of shared cultural memory.

Guggenheim Museum. Visiting the global icon of modern art and architecture, symbolising the transformation and cultural renaissance of Bilbao. The story of how the Guggenheim Museum contributed to the phenomenon, dubbed the "Bilbao effect".

DAY 4 – Responsible Use and Personal Well-being Plan

Introduction and presentation of the mobility programme for Day 4. Explores the role of sports in shaping local identity, unity and cultural pride.

Athletic Club Museum. Exploring how football promotes unity values in the Basque region. In the visit to the Athletic Museum, a historical overview of Biscayan society will be presented, and see how sport has helped preserve tradition, promote inclusion, and strengthen community ties.

Closing ceremony and certificates. Delivery of certificates, group photo, and farewell pintxo break. A final reflection on how to continue learning and leading confidently in the digital era.

COMPETENCES to be acquired by the participant



The adult listener understands the meaning of terms such as stereotyping, prejudice and other forms of misinformation.

The adult learner is familiar with examples of successful integration strategies that promote changes in the thinking, attitudes and behaviour of both migrants and host communities.

The adult learner is able to use examples and experiences from the mobility programme as inspiration to create a similar initiative (or elements of it) in their local environment in cooperation with other participants.

Ongoing contact with the mobility participant.



Individual interviews.



Questionnaire before and after mobility.



Reflections and debates where the quality of the learning outcomes will be assessed.



Mentoring by the host and the sending organisation.



Meetings with other participants in the mobility.



Verification of the participant's concerns and expectations.



Participant report.
